SECTION 4. FIRST-AID MEASURES

First-aid Measures

Inhalation

Move to fresh air. Call a Poison Centre or doctor if you feel unwell.

Skin Contact

Immediately wash gently and thoroughly with lukewarm, gently flowing water and mild soap for 15-20 minutes. Immediately call a Poison Centre or doctor.

Eye Contact

Immediately rinse the contaminated eye(s) with lukewarm, gently flowing water for 15-20 minutes, while holding the eyelid(s) open. Remove contact lenses, if present and easy to do. Immediately call a Poison Centre or doctor.

Ingestion

Never give anything by mouth if person is rapidly losing consciousness, or is unconscious or convulsing. Do not induce vomiting. If vomiting occurs naturally, lie on your side in the recovery position. Rinse mouth with water again. Immediately call a Poison Centre or doctor.

Digestive system, eyes, respiratory system, skin.

SECTION 5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

Extinguishing Media

Suitable Extinguishing Media

Not combustible. Use extinguishing agent suitable for surrounding fire. Carbon dioxide, dry chemical powder or appropriate foam.

Specific Hazards Arising from the Product

May include but is not limited to: very toxic carbon monoxide, carbon dioxide; corrosive sulfur oxides.

SECTION 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Personal Precautions, Protective Equipment, and Emergency Procedures
